

Boy, 16, Killed

One person was killed and 17 others injured in automobile accidents in Sonoma Valley last weekend and this week.

Larry Gilbert Seelye, 16-year-old freshman at Sonoma Valley Union high school, was killed late Friday when a car in which he was riding overturned on Agua Caliente road, east of Highway 12, in Boyes Hot Springs. He was dead on arrival at Sonoma Valley Hospital after the accident.

The crash occurred when the

car, driven by Tom Stewart, 15, of El Verano, went out of control on the Caliente road grade after it hit a bump, witnesses said. The brakes apparently failed and the automobile rolled over several times. It crashed through a fence and came to rest near the home of Hans C. Huttehall.

Larry Seelye was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd A. Seelye of Agua Caliente. He was born in Montana.

In addition to his parents, he

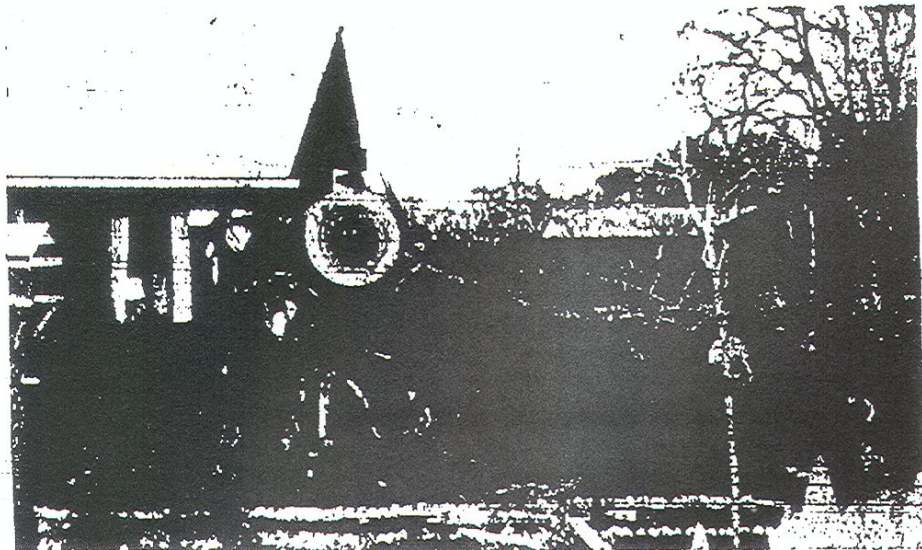
is survived by three sisters, Mrs. Dorothy Westzeon, Montana; Mrs. Beatrice Stevenson, El Verano; Mrs. Fay Menager, Montana, and seven brothers, Kenneth, of Martinez; Harold of Montana, Laurin of Cloverdale, Duane of Napa, William and Ray of Geyserville and Wayne of Agua Caliente.
