## MRS. NELLIE M. SEELY

Mrs. Nellie Miller Seely, a milliner, artist, poet and song-writer, died Sunday at her home at 969 NE Hazelfern Pl. Funeral will be Wednesday at 10 a.m. at Caldwell's Colonial Mortuary, followed by interment in IOOF Cemetery, Lebanon.

Mrs. Seely, 89, was born July 14, 1878, in Junction City, and had been a Portland resident for 14 years. She contributed to (anthologies) *American Voices*, 1936; *Yesterbook of Contemporary Poetry*, 1936-37; *Crown*, 1937; *Modern American Poetry*, 1938; and several newspapers. "Blue Night" is the best known of several songs she wrote and published.

Mrs. Seely's hobbies were flower gardening and interior decorating. She was a member of the Methodist Church and Marguerite Chapter No. 60 Order of Eastern Star, Lebanon. She also studied art and sold many oil paintings.

Survivors include a daughter, Mrs. Joel C. Booth, Portland; several nieces and nephews.
