FROM THE PEN OF THE PRESIDENT

By now you all know that the Seventh Generation Families Book has been compiled. This book is the third to be compiled and printed by the Seeley Genealogical Society concerning the descendants of Robert Seeley (1602-1667) and Obadiah Seeley (1614-1657).

Copies of these three issues have been sent to some of the larger Libraries and Genealogical Research Centers in the United States. How about the local places that you and I visit each year to search and record our family history and lineage? I would like to see these books in the genealogical section of every library that would like a copy and will accept books of family history. I have received a few replies, thanking the SGS for sending copies and saying that they welcome the material for their genealogy section.

In the last year we have found the name of

at least one small city, Davison, Michigan, which was founded by a Seeley, or Seelye. I sent a copy of all three books compiled by the Seeley Genealogical Society to the Davison Area Historical Museum. How many more places are there, that also were started by a Seeley that we are unaware of? How many of you know of such a place? That information would be more then welcomed by the Society, that data could be added to the records of the SGS Research Center in Abilene.

I am asking two things of each member. First: go to your local Library and Genealogical Society and see if they have any information on our Seeley surname. Ask them if they would like to add copies of the three Seeley Genealogical Society books to their files. If so, send me the contact person's name and address. Also ask them if they would like to receive copies of the SGS

A NEWSLETTER SUCCESS STORY

The August 2000 edition of the Seeley Genealogical Society Newsletter carried an article entitled "Any Kin of Lawrence Seeley? Friend Hopes to Find You." As a result of this publication, Paul Seely of Vero Beach, FL, contacted Mr. John Bagby, identifying himself as a relative of Lawrence Seeley. Mr. Bagby had also received information from other relatives stating that Mr. Seeley's wife, Frances S. Seeley, and two children, David Laurence and Stephanie Anne, were in fact alive and resided in the Rochester area.

Mrs. Seeley told Mr. Bagby that in the 1960s, Mr. Seeley just picked up one day and left and was never heard from again. Based on these contacts, Mr. Bagby reports that Mr. Seeley's father was named Richard, and his mother was Tina, and possibly one of his grand-mothers was named Cora Bauda. The family is working with Mr. Bagby for proper handling of Mr. Seeley's remains.

Mr. Paul Seely and Mr. John Bagby have both expressed their appreciation to the Seeley Genealogical Society for their help in locating the relatives of Mr. Lawrence Seeley.

For Our 2003 SGS Reunion, I Nominate Virginia's Historic Triangle Williamsburg, Jamestown, Yorktown

A suggestion was made at the 1999 SGS Reunion in Abilene, KS that we consider Williamsburg, VA as a site for an SGS Reunion. After considerable thought, and discussion with my family, we would like to propose to the members of SGS that you approve Williamsburg, VA as the site for your Reunion in September 2003. With the help of SGS Members from Virginia and North Carolina, I would like to be your host because it is so beautiful, so historic and I'm sure everyone would have an unforgettable time.

Historical Brief: The American adventure began at **Jamestown**, where 104 men and boys carved out of the wilderness the first permanent English colony in the New World in 1607.

From 1699 to 1780, **Williamsburg** was the political, social and cultural capital of Britain's largest, wealthiest and most populous North American colony. Here George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Patrick Henry, George Mason and other Virginia patriots debated the ideas – liberty, independence and personal freedom – that led to the founding of American democracy.

Yorktown is celebrated as the site of the last major battle of the American Revolutionary War where, on October 19, 1781 the British troops under General Cornwallis surrendered to General George Washington and his French allies.

Geographical: Jamestown, Williamsburg and Yorktown are within about 15 miles of each other on a peninsula formed by the James River to the south, the York River to the north and the Chesapeake Bay to the east in south Virginia. The beautiful Colonial Parkway connects these historical sites. Williamsburg is easily accessible by auto (Interstate 64) and airplane (Richmond International, Norfolk International, Patrick Henry International in Newport News and little Williamsburg Jamestown Airport).

The Williamsburg Area Convention and Visitors Bureau have offered their assistance in planning our SGS Reunion. Even though they know we will not be voting on a 2003 Reunion site until September 2001, many area motels, with facilities that will meet our needs and at prices comparable to what we have paid at previous SGS Reunion sites, have sent proposals with promotional material. I plan to bring videos and brochures to the SGS Reunion in September 2001 in Tacoma, WA for members to view.

Speakers: I plan to seek candidates for interesting speakers on genealogy and history sub-

I am trying to determine the ancestry of John Seeley. My ancestor, John Chambers was in Wyoming. Chambers and Seeleys are associated from early on when Robert Seeley and Thomas Chambers were both in New Haven. The families never seem to "connect" but have many associations for a couple hundred years including two sisters from Ireland, one who married my great grandfather and one who married Benjamin Seeley. I am trying to determine if this John Chambers/John Seeley is another close connection between MY Chambers and the Seeley family. About 1784 a John Chambers

and John Seeley were both appointed Justices of the Peace in the CT County of West-moreland which was actually northeastern Pennsylvania. Questions are: was the JP John Seeley from Morris Co New Jersey, married Elizabeth Lindsley and migrated to Lindley, NY about 1800 or was the JP John Seeley enumerated in the census for Luzeme County PA 1810?

SGS Interim Response: Dan Seelye replied to Carol that the only information he could find is a Martha Seeley, daughter of Daniel & Phebe (Wood) Seeley, who married a John Chambers. She was born about 1795 in Sara. Co. NY. This was from the SGS files of John Seely. (Data as of 17 October 2000)

Subject: Nathaniel Seeley

Susanne is trying to find additional descendants of Nathaniel Seeley (b. 19 Sep 1796 in Connecticut, d. 2 Jul 1876 in Middlefield, Ohio). He married Betsey Warren (b. 19 Aug 1798 in New York State, d. 14 Feb 1888 in Middlefield, Ohio). They were married 21 Dec 1818 in South Harpersfield, Ohio. Susanne Gruber Marshall provided lineage sheets with her line back to the Nathaniel (above). Her line is summarized as follows: Nathaniel, Lois Seeley (b. Apr 1822), Laura Gray (b. 1846), Amber Nickerson (b. 30 Jan 1868), Laura Chapman (b. 21 Nov 1889), Harland Altrogge (b. 6 Jun 1919), Anna Altrogge (b. 15 Aug 1941) and Susanne Gruber (b. 22 Feb 1966)(submitter).

Susan Kruse believes Jemima may be daughter of John Selea from Hampton, NH who moved into ME and resided Biddleford 1734 because there are large gaps in his children of record. Cecil's husband's great-grandfather's name is Cecil Andrew Seely (possibly spelled Sealy), b. in Aug 1869 in Benton Co., AR and d. 1907/8 in Allen, OK. He married Nannie Bell Russell 9 Sep 1888 in Wyat Cossett, AR. His father's name was William H. Seely. Cecil & Nannie had a daughter, Desma Opal Seely, b. 2 Oct 1906 in Whitesboro, Grayson Co., TX. Desma m. William Thomas Atwood 7 Feb 1925. Crystal has been told that Cecil Andrew Seely was a Sheriff and was shot during a card game around 1907 or 1908 in Allen, OK.

Child: Charles Morris Seeley (b. 19 Dec 1845, d. 15 Dec 1914-NYC) m. Ida Sophia Bullard (b. 25 Feb 1855-Wellsboro, PA, d. 7 Jul 1892-Wellsboro, PA). They had 7 children, the youngest was Lynn's grandmother Mildred Seeley (b. 11 Jun 1892, d. 30 Oct 1967) m. Charles Fay Erway. Do you have anything on this line?

SGS Response: Dan Seelye responded that John Seely's database showed Charles Seeley was b. ca 1805 Ovid, Sene (Seneca?) County, NY, m. ca 1830 Ovid, Sene Co, NY Sally Brundage (b. ca 1810, Ovid, Sene Co, NY.

John Seely responded that he had names of the 7 children of Charles Morris & Ida Sophia (Bullard) Seeley. These names and spouses were based on the Wellsboro Gazette obituaries which Rhoda Ladd loaned John Seely years ago. He does not have com-

plete dates for the vital records. Charles & Sarah (Brundage) Seeley were m 30 Jan 1830 in Ovid, NY as recorded in the Ithica Chronicle of 13 Jul 1830, page 3. The other 6 children were Jessie (b. ca 1882, d. ca 1965 in Concord, NY, m. Jack Towner of New York City), Sarah H. (b. ca 1886, d. ca 1963 in NYC, m. Edward Welch), Fred Graves (b. ca 1887, d. ca 1927 in NYC, m. Margaret (__)), a daughter (b. ca 1890, living in 1945 in Brooklyn, NY, m. H.W. Gaither), Harry M. A TRIBUTE TO THOSE WHO AUTHORED THE SGS PUBLICATIONS DEPICTING THE SEELEY DESCENDANCY

I had long been "stuck" in New York City trying to get beyond my great-grandfather, George W. B. Seelye. Through serendipity I met a fellow this summer in Santa Fe, NM, who is from Long Island and who uses with some frequency the New York Genealogical Society for his research. He offered to see what he could find about Seelys, and came up with information from the two volumes that broke my log jam. I had the names of my great-great grandparents on my great-grandfather's marriage license from a Manhattan church. Using the names on the marriage license, I was able to find in the two volumes the name Samuel Seely (#549), a great-great grandfather and the father of Samuel Wyx Seely (1853), a great-great grandfather and the father of George W. B. Seelye, my great grandfather. Now my next task is to take myself to Bedford and Pound Ridge, NY, and to Stamford, CT, and do some on-site investigation.

My great grandfather, George W. B. Seely, enlisted as a private in 1861 in the 44th Regiment of New York Volunteers and fought during the Peninsula Campaign. In October, 1862, lying in a hospital in Rhode Island, he was commissioned a Major in the 134th Regiment of New York Volunteers. Such a jump in rank indicates to me some kind of familial intervention. The fact that he ultimately died in Brooklyn and the Seelys of Connecticut had no mention in oral family tradition tells me that there was some kind of break. I guess I am detective enough to want to pursue that.

At any rate, I want to express my appreciation to those responsible for preparation of the three descendancy publications of the Seeley Genealogical Society. They were a real aid to me.
